I. BIOGRAPHICAL STATEMENT

Andrew D. Seidel's career thus far, when viewed overall, has been re-creating and presenting links between systematically-developed knowledge and physical planning and design. While not every effort has made these links explicitly, each book, article, class, presentation, invited lecture or even award shows Dr. Seidel as an individual capable in fields of scholarship from policy analysis to other social sciences to physical design.

He has for the past 16 years served as Professor in the Department of Landscape Architecture and Urban Planning and in the Department of Architecture at Texas A&M University. He is also the founding editor of a leading scholarly journal, the *Journal of Architectural and Planning Research (JAPR)* (with over 22 years of continuous quarterly publication), academic administrator, teacher, practitioner and researcher. After the nearly 30 years he has served as a professor, it is not unfair to say that Dr. Seidel is one of the internationally leading scholars in this subject.

Dr. Seidel's degrees are from architecture, analysis and administration in urban planning, public policy and research, and urban and regional planning. Throughout he has focused on the use of knowledge for decision making in these usually perceived disparate but, in fact, surprisingly similar areas of professional decision making

He is currently focusing his research on the profession and practice of the urban planner, the urban designer, the architect and the landscape architect and the developing systematically collected and analyzed knowledge for decision making by these professions. A recent book of his is the most comprehensive study of United Kingdom architects in practice done to date, including the results of an in-depth survey of 610 principals of firms. Current studies include similarly comprehensive corollary investigations in the United States and Australia examining not only the careers of architects but also landscape architects and urban planners. Additionally, if after his teaching and editing *JAPR* he has any time, he is under contract to write two books (with some very patient contributors and publishers). One concerns the social impact of tall buildings and the other investigates alternative career paths for architecture graduates.

Dr. Seidel came to Texas A&M University in 1988 as Chair of the Division of Design Philosophy within the College of Architecture. He subsequently accepted promotion to Director of Graduate Programs for the College of Architecture (an Associate Dean in this College). That position oversaw and directed all of the College's ten graduate degree programs for approximately 300 graduate students, as well as maintained all student records. While offered another Associate Dean position during the then Dean's a further reorganization of the College, Dr. Seidel decided to devote more of his energies to the *Journal of Architectural and Planning Research* and his research. *JAPR* is the only scholarly research journal to be affiliated with The American Institute of Architects and the Royal Institute of British Architects. Dr. Seidel's work on *JAPR* received the 1992 Achievement Award from the Environmental Design Research Association and the 1989 first place award in the scholarly or scientific category from the Successful Magazine Publishers Group.

Prior to joining the faculty at Texas A&M University, Dr. Seidel served as Professor of Facility Design and Management and Director of the master's degree program in Facility Design and Management in the Department of Human Environment and Design at Michigan State University. Dr. Seidel received the 1988 Educator Award from the International Facility Management Association.

In addition to professional degrees in architecture (B. Arch. from Pratt Institute) and city planning (M.C.P. from Harvard University), he holds a Ph.D. from The University of Michigan. He has taught graduate and undergraduate courses in research utilization, research methods for landscape architects, environment and behavior for architects, quantitative analysis for urban planners, organization and management of administration, strategies for social and organizational change and intervention, methods of qualitative and quantitative analysis, urban and regional planning, urban design, urban geography, and a community planning laboratory. He served as chair of the 10th and 25th international conferences of the Environmental Design Research Association, as well as co-chair of the 1998 conference of the

International Association for People -Environment Research, and was the editor of a blind-refereed book based on each conference's proceedings.

Professor Seidel has worked on the management staff of, and as a consultant to, state and local agencies and has served as the research project manager at the Harvard Graduate School of Design. He has a wide variety of professional association affiliations and has served on the Board of Directors of a number of international associations, as well as on the editorial boards of many scholarly journals. His publications have addressed ways in which research can benefit decision makers, especially designers and planners. He has conducted research on environmental concerns such as community planning profiles and vandalism in schools, the latter of which received the 1976 *Progressive Architecture*TM Applied Research Citation.

Subscriptions are sent to the People's Republic of China, the Council of Independent States, the Los Angeles and Moscow (Russia) Public Libraries, and to numerous university libraries all over the world. Authors reside in Saudi Arabia, Israel, the United States, Canada, France, Belgium, Singapore, Japan, and elsewhere. *JAPR's* recognition has become worldwide. In many sectors, according to reviews, it is considered the leading scholarly journal in its field and, to many, the only journal representing the breadth of environmental design research. (*JAPR* received a highly laudatory review in *J. of Planning Education and Research* 9(3):200-201.)

✍ Dr. Seidel has been successful in developing cooperating arrangements for *JAPR* with scholarly and professional societies. *JAPR* is published in cooperation with The American Institute of Architects, Architectural Research Centers Consortium, Environmental Design Research Association, International Association of Applied Psychology, International Association for the Study of People and their Surroundings (Europe), People and Physical Environment Research (Australasia), the Royal Institute of British Architects, and Society for Environmental Graphic Design. *JAPR* has received the Achievement Award from the Environmental Design Research Association and the award for First Place: Scholarly Journal from the Successful Magazine Publishing Group.

✍ This is the primary annual North American conference for professionals and academicians within the design and planning fields who pursue research interests related to the environmental design professions. Dr. Seidel organized and coordinated all elements of the preparation and production of the conference. This included budgetary planning and supervision; facilities; on-campus housing for registrants; proposal and paper review; newsletter; advertising and registration mailing; conference entertainment; pre-conference and on-site registrant requests; planning and execution of facilities for informal meetings, as well as planned sessions; on-site signage; participant communication; session scheduling; and numerous other responsibilities. The conference included over 120 program sessions and numerous social functions and was held on June 6-10.

✍ As first editor of the published conference proceedings, Dr. Seidel re-instituted the blind review of published papers and symposia, created a national review panel, prepared formal instructions to reviewers, and designed a review process to improve the quality of the published material. He was also responsible for the layout and production of the book itself. Through the use of on-campus housing and food services, he substantially reduced the overall cost of the conference to

the registrant below that of the two previous years. No release time from teaching duties was possible for this effort. Letters of commendation for this effort are available upon request.
